This course will enable participants who issue work permits to understand the different hot work permits, know the limitations of each permit and make decisions regarding the need for and correct use of each permit according to BHP Billiton Iron Ore Hot Work Procedure TRN-IHS-SAF-123. This course is designed for any person(s) required to perform hot work on a BHPBIO Site.

This course partially covers the requirements of MSAPMPER300B—Issue Work Permits (Hot Work/Confined Space) and is required to be run in conjunction with BHPBIO Hot Work Supervisor/Issue Permits (L3) to receive a Statement of Attainment to MSAPMPER300B.
